Dear Rafael.

My name is James W. Meng. I am a political refugee in Canada and the closest family member – a grandson – to J. Alan Smith, the key figure to the launch of SBS-1, the first high-bandwidth digital telecommunications satellite, launched in March 1980 by a subsidiary of IBM Corporation, Satellite Business Systems. These two things, believe it or not, are unfortunately very closely connected, and that rather quickly brings me to the subject of this letter.

I live in the Québec countryside about an hour from Montréal. On the evening of 11th January I wrote a brief e-mail message to my attorney, Jean-Marc Pham, in order to copy him on a draft of a letter I wrote for the purposes of updating the executive and security teams of IBM Corporation on various important aspects of my circumstances. This letter included a brief discussion of legacy, Cold War-era atomic-powered space devices – including the one my grandfather launched – and the reactors used to produce their fuel. I have attached it to this fax.

Within under 10 hours, criminals had utilised the warning system of the Toronto Pickering Nuclear Power Generation Station to perpetrate a massive hoax against the residents of the greater Toronto area, awakening thousands of people suddenly to a false warning, delivered via emergency radio bands and similar digital channels, of a nuclear meltdown incident at the facility.

This is the most gross, disgusting misuse of such a system, I believe, that has ever been perpetrated. I have undergone massive harrassment by the top-tier business school from which I graduated, London Business School, but this incident – which follows a similar pattern to earlier offenses – is without question the most egregious targeted psychological operations provocation of my lifetime. The Pickering reactor is based on a design conceived in the late 1960s and constructed in 1971 that was fatefully copied by the Soviets in the form of the Chernobyl reactor at Pripjat. It is a reactor that is fully capable of melting down, causing major human casualties in the process, and that is today also well beyond its originally-intended decommissioning date. Toronto residents know this.

I recommend that the IAEA mount a full investigation into this hoax. While the false positive incident that occurred the morning of 12th January had no material effect, a potential false negative carried out by the same depraved psychopaths could do enormous damage. I therefore implore you to take action immediately on this matter.
